## **HCTS APPLICATION DEADLINE: 31 JANUARY**

(Once selected by the selection committee, applicants will be nominated to our partner universities)

# **Required documents:**

- 1. HCTS study abroad application form
- 2. CV including extracurricular activities
- 3. **letter of motivation**, including the reason for choosing the partner university and a ranking of alternative choices, the classes you expect to take abroad and your career goals; we expect that you want to go abroad for the next winter semester but please explain in more detail if you want to stay for two semesters at your chosen university or go for other times
- 4. university certificates and transcripts of records
- 5. proof of **English proficiency** (TOEFL/IELTS) if you did not obtain a B.A. in an English-language program. Yale requires a TOEFL iBT min. 100, check whether necessary for your chosen destination
- 6. list your level of knowledge in other languages
- 7. for Yale University: name a potential academic supervisor at Yale suitable to your study plans
- 8. for Yale and SNU: name a teacher at Heidelberg willing to provide you with a letter of recommendation you don't need to submit one yet, as they have special forms for the submission, but you have to find someone willing to write such a letter even on short notice once you've been selected

All documents have to be in English (transcripts in English or German translation)

#### **MATS Applicants Requirements**

- 1. All MATS students should PASS the Introduction Class to Transcultural Studies
- ALL MATS students should COMPLETE 58 ECTS before leaving Heidelberg for study abroad (and should be registered for courses with an amount of at least 58 ECTS (=the first 4 modules of MATS-study, see description of modules)

- 3. All MATS students should obtain the **REGULAR MINIMUM OF 28 ECTS** during the study abroad semester
- 4. For MATS students all credits taken at another institution will count towards Mobility and Research 1 or 2, not for other modules (e.g. Skills)
- 5. Please identify a potential theme and supervisor for **your M.A. thesis** in the fourth semester and explain your choice in the application
- 6. Please be aware that all recipient of DAAD exchange scholarships (see below) have to complete their M.A. degree in the regular two years and **submit their M.A. Thesis by September 30**
- 7. Please be aware that students applying for the International Variant in Transcultural Studies with Kyoto University need to submit additional forms
- 8. Please be aware that all students in the International Variant with Kyoto University have to submit their M.A. Thesis by July 15

## **Applicants from OTHER Departments**

- Statement of your academic advisor that the planned exchange will be recognized by your degree program (counts towards your degree). Students in general are expected to obtain 30 ECTS during the semester abroad unless otherwise discussed beforehand.

---tuition waiver, recommendation: students are welcome to apply for a scholarship provided by the Confucius Institute

**Yonsei University** (contract in the making) Application no longer possible for this round

#### JOINT PROGRAMMES

M.A. in Transcultural Studies – International Variant (Joint Degree) with **Kyoto University** Graduate School of Letters. Currently five DAAD Scholarships for 10 months pending -> make sure to check the additionally required application documents for this program

Ph.D. in Asian and Transcultural Studies with Venice Ca' Foscari University, Faculty of Asian and North African Studies. Several Doctoral Fellowships for 36 months from the Venice side, ERASMUS funding from Heidelberg side

Ph.D. in International Studies Ph.D. with Tohoku University Graduate School of Law (One-year fellowship for stay in Sendai) and with Tohoku University Graduate School of Letters (Three-year fellowship entry via Tohoku University Japanese entrance exam)

# Frequently asked questions regarding the study abroad programs (FAQ)

Can I choose a university that is not listed as a partner in the list above?

**Option One**: Heidelberg University: International Office (IRO) (Akademisches Auslandsamt) general university exchange program:

**Option Two**: ask at another institute at Heidelberg University that already has an exchange agreement with the university that you are interested in

**Option Three**: organize your own stay. You are free to study at any other university in Europe or overseas upon approval of your academic advisor, but please be aware that you may have to pay full tuition fees, unless you can obtain an individual tuition waiver

# Which requirements do I have to meet?

You have to be a student of Heidelberg University and you need to meet the necessary language and research skills, set as condition by either the partner university or your study degree program, in order to participate in the exchange. Some of the exchange co-operations are based on a specific level or field of study (for example: exchange is open to all study levels, but limited to the field of Japanese Studies at Zurich University via ERASMUS).

## What happens after I sent in my application?

Usually, the applicants are informed by mid-February, whether they have been chosen as proper candidates for the exchange. Sometimes they are invited to an interview to verify their language and research skills. Please keep in mind - once you officially accepted the offer, you are no longer able to change or withdraw without damaging the overall program. Candidates will be officially nominated and have to complete an additional application/enrollment process at the partner university. Ultimately, the partner university is deciding whether or not someone's accepted to the exchange.

# What is the value of the ERASMUS scholarship and what are the criteria by which people are chosen?

All accepted candidates to study within the ERASMUS/ERASMUS+ framework are expected to receive the ERASMUS student mobility funding, as long as all necessary documents are handed in in time and the candidates meet all pre-set conditions (such as language skills, level and field of study).

# Do I have to pay tuition fees to the university abroad?

All study abroad partnerships have a tuition waiver — Heidelberg students are therefore exempted from paying tuition fees at the partner university (a small administrative fee may apply). Please note, students receiving full credits at the partner university during their exchange are usually expected to stay fully enrolled (without leave of absence or "Urlaubssemester") at Heidelberg University and therefore will have to pay the regular tuition fee and administrative costs in Heidelberg.

## What do I need to prepare PRIOR to leaving to study abroad?

All students need to conclude a learning agreement with their academic advisors. International students should check the regulations of their German study visa before leaving the country – staying abroad longer than 6 months needs to be approved by the immigration authority "Ausländerbehörde". All students need to apply for a respective visa on their own and as soon as possible.
